Events happened on 6/4 & 6/6; over 300 attended on 6/4. Set up organizational meeting on 6/13. Group spoke with Police Chief Georgie and he was very open to the demonstration.

Roz Baker – Spoke of a Courageous Conversation Grp based on the book of the same name authored by Glenn Singleton as a tool to be shared exploring racial language protocol thru the history of U.S. Roz offered to share a power point presentation with us.

Legislation Round-up

<u>Danielle Gregoire</u>-Working on re-opening state with Governor Baker.

Voting-the House requires every registered voter an early voting application for both primary and general going to senate for a vote.

The state house passed a provisional act to extend the time for restaurants to pay their taxes.

Changes to the MA State flag are moving thru the senate. Symbols of sword and Indian have become offensive in current times.

<u>Carmine Gentile</u> - Early voting dates:

State Primary Early Voting In-Person Aug 22-28
State Election Early Voting In-Person October 17-30

Black - Latino Caucus Submitted a 10 Point Statement The following 3 have been agreed upon immediately.

- Immediately create an independent Office of Standards and Professional Conduct.
- Immediate changes to policy/laws including the following:
- Abolition use of choke hold by law enforcement;
- The establishment of an affirmative obligation for
- All law enforcement officers to intervene in a situation where a fellow officer improperly/illegally use force.
- Establishment of a special legislative commission to study and examine the civil service law and recommend changes to ensure more opportunity for minority recruitment

The remaining 7 points will be discussed and worked out.

Combating Racism- Carmine co-sponsored bill that will publish reports on all injuries and deaths by police officers.

\$300 million to be approved for repair of state roads and bridges

Bill to allow uniform method of spraying for mosquito throughout the state.

\$6 Billion dollar deficit in Mass budget. 12 -15% cut in local aid and cut in school staff. State may do a bond. State may begin taxing companies over seas.

State to extend deadline for Budget. 1/12 of annual budget will be assigned to July.

Carmine has a conservative opponent in the general election.
