**Speaker: Sonia Chang-Diaz, Democratic Candidate for Governor** Background - Has been state senator since 2008. Began as a schoolteacher in Lynn. Working in Lynn she saw how poorly the school did not provide enough for the marginal students therefore slipped thru the cracks of the educational system. This experience led her to become a grassroots organizer and to run for State Senator in 2008 promoting financial equity, reforming police, fixing the broken education system. There is so much money in the criminal legal system that doesn't need to be there. We have the Comprehensive Criminal Justice Reform Bill passed in 2017/18. She has been fighting for the Justice Re-investment Act since then. The second half of it has been codified and written into this year's budget. From this Act the Community Re-investment Fund has been created this year. There is \$15 million in the fund currently. This fund is for virtuous cycle of services including criminal prevention, wrap around services and economic empowerment. The first half of the Justice Re-Investment Act includes all the money required for incarceration. But as the carcerated population goes down so does the money requirements. There needs to be a dedicated system for pulling money out so it can be intentionally invested into prevention services.

She wrote, championed and won landmark education funding to provide \$1.5 billion in new aid to K-12 districts throughout Massachusetts. She led the charge for repealing racist sentencing rules. Also sponsored and won multiple protections for trans Bay Stators. Had sponsored Environmental justice reforms and curtailed the misuse of special education dollars.

Wants to work on solutions with big ideas for climate change, equity and justice economy and erase the wealth divide. Continue equal rights in education, police reform, racial reckoning, building 21st century transit transportation. Building and working with grassroots organizations with strong leaders is how we begin the work ahead of us.
