Legislation Round-Up

Carmine Gentile – State Representative 13th Middlesex District

- House has passed a bill on 3/11 that will not tax Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (OUA). This will place S-Corp and LLC businesses on the same footing as C Corporation employers who will not be paying federal or state income tax on PUA benefits received and paid to employees.
- State will extend an additional 40hr paid sick time-due to COVID-19.
- Postpone single business owners' raise of employers contribution to unemployment insurance

Danielle Gregoire: State Rep, 14th Middlesex District

Climate bill that was previously vetoed by Gov Baker and immediately refilled is up for vote again.

Questions:

Diane Stevens – Why is the Governor opposed to the Climate bill?

Danielle G. - The Governor has concerns that the bill adds too big of a cost to business. The legislature is willing to work with the Governor on some of the changes but not all of them.

Doug Pizzi- I want to thank both Carmine and Danielle on signing on as co-sponsors of a bill for Public Lands Preservation Act.

Local Government Round-up

Samantha Perlman – City Councilor at Large

Three resolutions were filed and passed in City Council last Monday (3/8) to be sent to state legislators;

- State Dept of Health to do an impact analysis of the proposed site of Mass General Brigham Hospital to be located in Westborough Would it increase health costs? How will this impact Marlborough Hospital?
- State providing vaccinations to be given at local Board of Health Depts. instead of regional sites.
- Would traffic lights on route 20 east be supported by the legislators if the McGee Farm property goes forward.

Danielle G.- To be clear I was aware of the resolution by reading the City Council Agenda but we have not yet received the resolutions at the state legislature. It was sent by the Mayor and the President of the City Council.

Need to have a better flow of communication. A lot of conflicting info about where and when vaccines would be available in Marlborough. The City reassigned the responsibility to the Marlborough UMass Hospital. A vaccination site finally opened up at the Marriott on rte 20 west. They have 500 1^{st} doses, 500 2^{nd} doses and another 500 doses are due next week.

Comments:

Barbara Allen- Used the preregistration online at 6am. Worked fine with no glitches.

Laura Wagner: Ward 1 City Councilor

Public hearing for the Marlborough Dept of Health scheduled for April 6th.

Dave Doucette: Ward 2 City Councilor

Confirms that the Marriott Hotel site is up and running giving out vaccines as long as the doses are available.

Made request to our State Reps Carmine G. and Danielle G. to look into the breakdown of municipalities as to how many people of that have received vaccines. Would be helpful tracking data. Concerned people who have trouble getting to vaccination sites because of no transportation are missing out on vaccinations. Process may turn into an implicit limitation.

Currently involved in updating a fencing ordinance.

Michelle Bodin-Hettinger: Marlborough School Committee

Still a rollercoaster ride for the kids; are they in or out of school. Governor Baker's edict is to have $PreK - 5^{th}$ grades to be in school fulltime by April 5th.

In Marlborough the lower grades PreK thru 2nd grade are currently in school and has been since the fall. School classes Grades 3 thru 5 poses more difficulty keeping the students spaced between 3 and 6ft apart. Will have to manage. The Middle School students will be back in school full time by April 28th. H.S. is scheduled to open as well but no date has been set as to when they will return to school full time.

Received 2022 budget. Committee is working thru the process. Intent is to have a zero increase budget. School Committee won't have the funds from the gov't that they had this year. There will be a public hearing in about 4 weeks.

Question – Roz Baker

1. Came in late wanted to hear Laura's report on the General Brigham Hospital proposed site in Westborough. What is the Mayor's plan and why does it create the city's apprehension to it.

Laura Wagner reiterated that there is concern that the funding for low income/medicaid patients being treated in Marlborough Hospital would go down if the Westborough Hospital came into being because the patients with "commercial" insurance would tend to go to Westborough thereby decreasing the insurance dollars in Marlborough.

2. People cannot get to larger regional sites—What is Marlborough doing to resolve this?

Dave Doucette explained that originally the vaccines were being done at the Senior Center in Marlborough. The number of vaccines needed was not being delivered to Marlborough. There is only a limited supply of vaccines from the state. The Mayor thought there would be 750 vaccines a day and was only able to distribute 500/week. The mayor became frustrated with the low quantity of the vaccines received. Then the Marlborough Hospital managed the vaccine supply and had the vaccinations done at the Marriott Hotel.

Danielle G.- To be perfectly clear, Trish Pope called me 3 weeks ago and asked what I could do to help the Sr Center set up the site for 750 vaccinations/day. Went to State Rep Carmine G. and together we organized a grp of people to manage the site. Just as we were ready to begin this operation I received a call from Marlborough Board of Health. The Board stipulated to us that the Mayor's intention is to stop vaccinating people in the city and pass it over to Marlborough Hospital.

New Business – Dan Caruso, Chair

Re-energizing our organization. Redefining our roles. Time to develop into a real Democratic organization. Will bring this up to the Executive Committee including Ward Chairs and write up a blurb to distribute at a later date.
